Because **2026 is a Humboldt County year**, Lake and Mendocino County schools will not participate in the in-person Education Day tours—our usual rotation. Even so, your classrooms remain an important part of the Forest Education Program, and **we are thrilled to continue welcoming your murals!** Your students' creativity has become a highlight of the conference, and we look forward to proudly displaying your work in Ferndale for thousands of visitors to enjoy.

2026 Mural Contest Rules for Grades K-8th

- 1. The mural must portray the 2026 Conference theme: "FROM DUGOUTS TO DECKING: WHERE TEAMWORK BUILDS TIMBER'S FUTURE.".
- 2. Murals must be created on the Conference-issued pulp sheet. Only one sheet will be provided per classroom. Because these sheets were recovered from the old Samoa Pulp Mill and cannot be reproduced, our inventory is limited. We kindly ask that teachers request a sheet **only if they plan to use it.**
- 3. Creativity is encouraged! Murals can be created using a variety of materials, including crayons, watercolors, poster paints, and paper collages. To ensure we can safely transport and display every submission, murals should remain flat and easy to stack. Murals that are too bulky or not suitable for wall hanging may not be judged or displayed.
- 4. Murals will be judged on the use of the conference theme, creative use of materials, and whole-class participation. The murals should be age-appropriate, with work done by the students, and innovative uses of wood products in the design. The murals should be a learning experience for students, demonstrating an understanding of the relationship between the forest and everyday life, the sustainability of a managed forest, and the many people working together to fulfill the importance of wood products in our lives.
- 5. The teacher's name, grade, school, and telephone number must be on a 3x5 card secured flat on the **bottom right-hand corner** of the mural, facing up with the writing visible (Please do not fold and staple).
- 6. Each class not receiving a cash prize will **RECEIVE \$50!**
- 7. **PRIZES:** The murals will be divided into two grade categories for judging: K-3rd grades and 4th-8th grades. If you have a 3/4 combination, the mural will be judged in the 4th-8th grade category. Prizes for winning murals in each category are:

HUMBOLDT/DELNORTE/TRINITY COUNTIES: First Place: \$200; Second Place: \$150; Third Place: \$100; And three Honorable Mentions of \$75 each for both age categories. (*Note: Classes winning Cash Prizes will not receive an additional \$50 Participation Reward.*)

MENDOCINO/LAKE COUNTIES: First Place: \$200; Second Place: \$150; Third Place: \$100; and three Honorable Mention of \$75 each for both age categories. (*Note: Classes winning Cash Prizes will not receive an additional \$50 Participation Reward.*)

- 8. Murals must be received for judging no later than **Friday**, **March 13**, **2026**, **at 5 PM**. Please deliver your completed mural to the following location:

- 9. Murals will be displayed during the Redwood Region Logging Conference, on March 13, 14, & 15, 2026.
- 10. The RRLC reserves the right to reproduce, publish, or publicly display any mural for promotional purposes. RRLC reserves the right to retain ownership of any mural; however, efforts will be made to return the murals.
- 11. Any mural that the RRLC Education Committee determines to be inappropriate will be disqualified, will not receive the participation award, and will not be displayed at the conference.
